Terms and Conditions

The organiser is 33rd Slaithwaite Scout Group

The Promoter is Mr. Richard Izzard, Flat above Da Vinci's, 8 Kiln Hill, Slaithwaite, Huddersfield, West Yorkshire, HD7 5JS.

Slaithwaite Duck Race will be held on Saturday 13th June, 2026. Slaithwaite Duck Race and Slaithwaite Corporate Duck Race will run as separate lotteries, though all ducks will be released simultaneously.

The lotteries are authorised by Lottery Licence number SL0277, issued by Kirklees Council.

Tickets can only be sold to persons 16 years of age and older.

All profits from the lotteries will be used to support the general work of 33rd Slaithwaite Scout Group to provide adventures for our young people. The Duck Race management team may select additional beneficiaries as they see fit.

Participation in the lotteries can be made by purchase of one or more tickets from any family of the Scout group, through our Facebook page (<https://www.facebook.com/SlaithwaiteDuckRace>) or online through Ticket Source at Slaithwaite Duck Race.

33rd Slaithwaite Scout Group accepts no responsibility for tickets which are lost, damaged or illegible, from which the prize-winner cannot be identified or for any technical failure or event which may cause the competition to be disrupted or corrupted.

Any ticket entries received after the closing date may miss entry into the lotteries and therefore will be considered as a donation to 33rd Slaithwaite Scout Group.

As soon as practicable after the event, participants with winning tickets will be notified by the competition's organisers by email, telephone or post according to the contact details provided by the purchaser at the time of purchase.

The winning ticket numbers will be made available on the Slaithwaite Duck Race Facebook page, for a period of at least six months after the races have been held.

If it is impractical to run the races as planned, because of river conditions or any other reason, a member of the public will be asked to select, at random and in a public place, winning ticket numbers from all the ticket numbers that were to participate in the races.

In the event that a group of ducks pass the winning line together, the designated marshal will scoop all this group of ducks up and select the winners at random from this group.

The result of the race, as declared by the organisers, is final. No correspondence will be entered into.

There are no alternatives to non-cash prizes, in whole or in part. Non cash prizes have no redeemable cash value and may be time limited.

33rd Slaithwaite Scout Group or Slaithwaite Duck Race organisers shall not be liable for any loss or damage whatsoever suffered (including, but not limited to, direct, indirect, and/or consequential loss) or personal injury suffered or sustained in connection with the prizes or any part of them. There may be certain conditions attached to non-cash prizes. For example, age restrictions and / or requirements for certain documentation. Non-cash prizes may not be awarded to participants under the legal age for that product.

Players should retain a record of their allocated ticket numbers as proof of purchase and may be asked to produce such records when claiming prizes.

Prize money will normally be paid by BACS payment to a UK bank or Sterling cheque, drawn on a UK bank. Cash prizes will usually be paid within 28 days of the race.

Where the organiser is unable to contact a prize-winner and that a prize remains unclaimed for six months following the organiser's first attempt to notify the prize-winner, the organiser may apply the prize as it sees fit, including re-offering the prize in future events.

By claiming and accepting a prize players agree to publicity which will be carried out at the sole discretion of 33rd Slaithwaite Scout Group. All players are required to co-operate with the organiser's right to publish their win, as and when deemed appropriate, and to provide proof of age when requested.

In the event of an error, howsoever caused, whether electronic, printing error or otherwise and whether obvious or otherwise, which affects the competition in any way, the organisers reserve the right to administer the lottery as though the error had not occurred. Where the organiser deems it appropriate and/or feasible the organiser will notify entrants of the error.

Failure to comply with any of these rules may result in the disqualification of an entry in the lottery.

The organiser reserves the right to disqualify any entry at their absolute discretion.
